

Residents can also complete an online survey available between Tuesday, 1 February and Friday, 25 February.



COUNCIL PARTICIPATING IN INTERNET OF THINGS (IOT) TECHNOLOGY TRIAL

Sensors will soon be installed outside the toilets at Atkinson Park, Kerang as part of Council's participation in the Smart Cities project.

The sensors, which form part of a 12-month Internet of Things (lot) trial across the Mallee, will provide Council with a greater understanding of how the toilets and car park are utilised.

One three-dimensional, Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning sensor will focus on the Atkinson Park car park, whilst two infrared and heat sensors will measure how frequently the public toilets are utilised.

COHUNA CHILD CARE ONE STEP CLOSER

The creation of Long Day Care and sufficient kindergarten options for Cohuna and district residents is one step closer to fruition after Council received \$65,800 from the State Government's 2021/22 Building Blocks Planning Program to explore future kindergarten service delivery and models of care for Cohuna, as well as the potential to also provide Long Day Care in the town.

Since this important issue was raised with Council in April 2021, Council has been working proactively with residents who led this community campaign and the State Government to find a solution that would be beneficial for the community and families accessing this much-needed service.

This funding will enable Council to explore a children's hub model, bringing together three-year-old kindergarten, four-year-old kindergarten, Maternal and Child Health services, Supported Playgroup and Long Day Care.

It is hoped that the end result will be a modern, purpose-built centre that will embrace the advantages of indoor/outdoor programming, bush kindergarten programs and explore service models which give working families flexible options.

Investigations are scheduled to be completed by mid-2022, with the report to assist with seeking funding for the construction of the proposed facility.

State Minister for Local Government, Shaun Leane MP recently announced Council will receive a \$1.5 million contribution from the Living Libraries Infrastructure Program 2021 - Major Works program towards the \$1.507 million project.

To be completed by mid-2024, *The Glasshouse @ The Gannawarra* will feature a media lab designed to support movie making, sound and music recording and other creative digital technology projects, new meeting spaces to support community groups and events, and a glass façade that will enable the opportunity for evening activation using light projection and sound.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



TOURISM ATTRACTIONS RECOGNISED

Two Gannawarra tourism attractions are in the running for a major local government award.

Koondrook Retreat (above) and the Cohuna Waterfront Development (below) are in the running for the inaugural 2022 LGPro Awards for Excellence Outstanding Small Rural Council Initiative.

Opened in November 2020, the Cohuna Waterfront Development included the creation of Cohuna Beach, construction of new toilet facilities and barbecue shelters in Apex Park and redesign of vehicle access to the area.

Koondrook Retreat – which opened in December 2020 – has captured the flourishing "glamping market", with the facility's six glamourous safari-style tents enabling visitors to immerse in the surrounds around Gunbower Creek and the adjoining Gunbower Forest.

The winning initiative will be announced during the 2022 LGPro Annual Conference Dinner on 24 February.



KERANGLINK UPDATE

Billions of dollars worth of renewable energy projects will proceed in the Gannawarra after the Australian Energy Market Operator recommended for the Victorian and Federal governments to proceed with developing KerangLink.

The project, scheduled for completion by 2031, will connect Victoria and New South Wales' electricity network via infrastructure that passes through the municipality, with the upgrading of current infrastructure and development of new transmission lines enabling local renewable energy facilities to feed into the national grid.

The development of KerangLink and the projects it will enable to support will create thousands of jobs in the years to come and potential millions to Council in future Payment in Lieu of Rate payments.

KerangLink would not be possible without the support and advocacy from local, State and Federal government colleagues. These include Federal Member for Mallee, Anne Webster; State Minister for Energy, Lily D'Ambrosio; State Government departments, including the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning, Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions, and Regional Development Victoria; Mallee Regional Partnership; Murray River Group of Councils; and the Loddon Campaspe Group of Councils.



PROJECTS UPDATE

THE GANNAWARRA'S CONSTRUCTION BLITZ CONTINUES

Work continues across the Gannawarra Shire to roll out Council's \$16.542 million capital works program, which is supporting town developments, investment in recreational facility improvements and tourism initiatives.

BOOST FOR KEY WORKS

Stages 5 and 6 of the Murrabit Stormwater Project and Stage 3 of the Kerang CBD Redevelopment - which will upgrade street furniture and pavements from Victoria Street leading into Wellington Street - will proceed after Council received \$2.636 million from the third round of the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

MURRABIT STORMWATER PROJECT CONTINUES

Work to transform Murrabit's stormwater network from an open drain to an underground drainage infrastructure system recently resumed.





drains along a number of streets was completed in late 2021, with work now focusing on Gonn Avenue, south of Browning Avenue.

This \$1.1 million project is funded by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.


COHUNA WATERFRONT PROJECT - STAGE 2

Stage 2 of the Cohuna Waterfront Project, which will improve connections between Gunbower Creek and the Cohuna central business district, will be completed in April.

Work on this project began prior to Christmas, with improvements made to the footpath along King George Street adjacent to Garden Park (right).

As part of the improvements currently underway, a deck pontoon will be constructed on the banks of Gunbower Creek, dedicated outdoor dining areas will be created either side of the King George Street pedestrian crossing and a seated area will be installed at the intersection of King George and Sampson streets.

The project is part of the \$3.4 million Cohuna CBD and Waterfront Connections Project and is supported by the Federal Government's Regional Growth Fund.



PROJECTS UPDATE

ALL ABILITIES PLAYGROUNDS UPDATE

Residents and visitors are benefiting from the construction of two all abilities playgrounds.

Celebrations occurred on 14 December 2021 when Mayor Charlie Gillingham (top left, pictured with Deputy Mayor, Cr Jane Ogden and Council Chief Executive Officer, Tom O'Reilly) officially opened the Koondrook All Abilities Playground.

Residents and visitors to Apex Park, Cohuna have enjoyed exploring some of the completed sections of the Cohuna All Abilities Adventure Playground, which opened at the end of December (below). Featuring a carousel, seated swing, stand-up see saw that pumps water into a water channel, a three-storey play area designed as an old farm shack, climbing areas and flying fox, this space celebrates Cohuna's agricultural links and the area's connection to Gunbower Creek. Sections of the park still to be completed are scheduled to be opened in early 2022.

Meanwhile, construction of the Kerang All Abilities Playground, to be located adjacent to the Atkinson Park playground, will begin in early 2022. This project also involves the construction of the first Changing Places facility in the municipality. Featuring a height-adjustable adult-sized change table, ceiling track hoist system and a peninsular-structured toilet, the space will provide suitable facilities for people who cannot use standard accessible toilets.









GANNAWARRA SHIRE CHILDREN'S CENTRE EXPANSION

Families will soon be able to experience the expanded Gannawarra Shire Children's Centre, with the final stage of the project occurring throughout January.

Once complete, the Kerang-based centre will be able to accommodate a subsidised three-year-old kindergarten program alongside the popular four-year-old kindergarten program.

The project, funded through the Victorian State Government's Building Blocks Program and the Victorian School's Building Authority, will also increase the centre's capacity from 95 places to 126 places.
