# HAVE YOUR SAY ON THE DRAFT FINANCIAL PLAN



An event to acknowledge NAIDOC and Reconciliation weeks was held in Kerang during July. The day included a flag raising ceremony in Victoria Street, before a walk to the Sir John Gorton Library where the crowd witnessed an official

Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony by Hack Webster, a Story Time session led by Damian Murray and a Question and Answer session with local Aboriginal Elders, Uncle Lloyd, Aunty Esther and Aunty Lil facilitated by the local youth indigenous group, Tyipen Kwe.

The event concluded with a morning tea featuring bush bread or seed cake, otherwise known as damper, a European term that refers to bread made by traditional owners for many thousands of years.

This annual event is a partnership between Council, Northern District Community Health, Mallee District Aboriginal Service and the Kerang Elders Group.





#### GANNAWARRA GIVING ACCOUNT

The Gannawarra Community Resilience Committee established a Gannawarra Giving Account in 2019. Since that time \$6,500 has been distributed through our local schools to help support children and their families in need. 52% of the funds have supported families with the purchase of school uniforms, 15% was spent on essential items for students and 5% spent on inclusion of children in swimming programs.

# PROJECTS UPDATE

# **CONSTRUCTION BLITZ ACROSS GANNAWARRA!**

A multi-million dollar construction blitz is underway across the Gannawarra, with a range of projects currently under construction.

These projects form part of the \$16.542 million capital works program Council will roll out during 2021/22, highlighted by town developments, investment in recreational facility improvements and supporting tourism initiatives.

A brief update on some key capital works projects across the municipality is included in this newsletter.

#### **SCORESBY STREET, KERANG**

Project: Kerang CBD Redevelopment— Stage Two

Funded through the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program

The second phase of the works in Kerang CBD commencing in Scoresby Street between Victoria Street and Fitzroy Street, is expected to be completed by end of December.

Key elements of this stage of the works include footpath enhancements and improving connections to the CBD from the train station.



#### **MORTON GARNER SHOW PAVILION PROGRESSING**

Project: Morton Garner Pavilion Upgrade

Funded through the Federal Government's Regional Agricultural Show Development Grants Program

The Cohuna Show Society was successful in obtaining funding to develop a new pavilion at the Cohuna Recreation Reserve. With a contribution from Council, the project is now underway and estimated to be completed at the end of 2022.

The project includes:

- Demolishing and removing the existing building,
- Erection of the new pavilion from a concept design approved by the Cohuna Show Society



## MILLION DOLLAR DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS AT MURRABIT

#### Project: Murrabit Township Stormwater Project

#### Funded through the Federal Government's Local Roads Community Infrastructure Program (Phase 2)

A \$1.1 million project that is going to revolutionise Murrabit by converting its current open drain stormwater network to an underground drainage infrastructure system.

Key elements of this project include:

- Enhanced liveability and amenity for residents and visitors by minimising deep spoon drains and standing water
- Installation of storm water drainage including a network of underground pipes collecting surface water from grass spoon drains via grated pits
- The water will be directed to a pump station at the corner of Browning Ave and Church St from where it will be pumped along Browning Ave to discharge into Reedy Creek
- A detention basin will be constructed on the land adjacent the pump to provide storage capacity during large rainfall events.

The works will progress in stages beginning with the detention basin and are expected to be complete by the end of 2021.

# GANNAWARRA SHIRE CHILDREN'S CENTRE EXPANSION UNDERWAY

Project: Gannawarra Children's Centre Expansion Project

Funded through the Victorian State Government's *Building Blocks Program* and the Victorian School's Building Authority

Key elements of this project include:

- Extending the north side of the current building to add an additional classroom that will allow the centre to be able to accommodate future subsidised 3-year-old Kindergarten classes.
- Increasing capacity from 95 to 126 places.

These works will be undertaken for the remainder of the year, with some services relocated for the duration of the project.

# KOONDROOK ALL-ABILITIES PLAYGROUND OPENING SOON!

#### Project: Koondrook All-Abilities Playground

#### Funded through the Victorian State Government's Regional Infrastructure Fund

Opening to the public soon, key elements of the playground, the first of its type to be built in the Gannawarra, include:

- Flying fox with an accessible harness, timber swings featuring accessible harness seating, an accessible carousel and in-ground trampolines
- Water and sand play areas, and shaded seating



# COHUNA ALL-ABILITIES PLAYGROUND BEGINS CONSTRUCTION

#### Project: Cohuna All Abilities Adventure Playground

Funded through the Victorian State Government's Rural and Regional Victoria Infrastructure Stimulus 2020 Grants Program

Key elements of the playground include:

- Carousel, seated swing, stand-up see saw that pumps water into a water channel, a three-storey play area designed as an old farm shack, climbing areas and flying fox
- Fencing and sealed footpaths for ease of access by prams and wheelchairs



# ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

## **GANNAWARRA VISITOR GUIDE OUT NOW**

# INDUSTRIAL EXPANSION

Council has maintained a supply of industrial land in the major centres as a means of creating jobs and diversity for the local economy.




Tate Drive in Kerang is

the largest estate and the recent development of Stage 9 has seen an additional 14 lots created. Demand has been strong with one lot already hosting a new factory for local manufacturing business, Faucet Stroman, while an additional seven lots are currently on hold pending sale for further business development. Tate Drive supports in excess of 150 jobs and around \$25m in local investment and is growing rapidly.

Further industrial estate planning is underway in Koondrook where Council and the community are looking at a site fronting Grigg Road. The greenfield site in Koondrook is likely to provide around 10 new allotments when developed. Further planning work is also underway for the Cohuna site with most of the land now sold and pending development.

Jobs growth is extremely strong right across the Gannawarra with around 400 plus jobs predicted across agriculture, mining, energy and manufacturing over the next few years. Agriculture alone is expected to create around 100 new jobs with poultry, pig and horticulture projects. A planning application has been received for a 16 shed free-range poultry project, while other major projects are undertaking due diligence and securing land. Intensive agriculture increases demand for local services especially from the grain industry and manufacturing.



### VICTORIAN SMALL BUSINESS BUS TO VISIT GANNAWARRA

OFFICIAL VISITOR GUIDE

The Victorian Small Business bus is scheduled to visit Kerang on Tuesday 7 September and Cohuna on Thursday 9 September (*pending COVID-19 restrictions*). The bus provides support and advice to small and emerging businesses to continue to grow in the Gannawarra Shire. Consultation sessions are free and no prior bookings are required.

A representative from the Rural Financial Counselling Service Victoria (West) will be present from 10am - 1pm, providing confidential, free business wellbeing support.

# ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

## **RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS**

The growth in jobs is now placing pressure on the local housing market and Council is facilitating several residential developments to try and alleviate the demand.

With Melbourne experiencing difficulties, residential developers are now looking to regional Victoria where demand is strong.

### **GANNAWARRA BRANDING**

New projects in Koondrook and Cohuna are great examples of the Gannawarra brand. The signage at the Koondrook Retreat feature indigenous artwork and

solid redgum logs that has a natural, earthy feel. The design is contemporary and artistic creating a point of difference that is becoming consistent across the Gannawarra. The Cohuna Beach sign maintains the contemporary look with redgum timber, charcoal and white signage and the inclusion of a surfboard to add



to the artistic look. Most of the tourism and signing for local parks use this consistent brand, with other examples being the Cohuna Skate Park, recreation reserve entry and signage along the Koondrook waterfront. The designs also feature across most of the Gannawarra.

Buildings are also key areas for branding with many of Cohuna's buildings linking back to the simple but earthy design and shape of the gateway centre building. The corrugated iron pitched roof, redgum timbers and soft colours all contribute to the earthy design features.

The Gannawarra brand is designed to replicate the natural feel of the redgum forests and wetlands and use artistic features to create a point of difference.

## **DEMAND FOR ENERGY**

Energy projects are still in demand across the Gannawarra with enquiries for major wind and solar projects received over the past 12 months. Much of the new development is planning to align with the proposed KerangLink project, a major interconnector line with New South Wales and South Australia. If all of the energy projects are developed they will only take up around .9% of available land in the Gannawarra and generate in excess of \$1.8m in revenue annually to Council.

A recent meeting with planning consultants has started the development of a planning permit application for a micro grid

in Kerang. A micro grid generates and stores energy that can then be retailed to local customers and is usually significantly cheaper for consumers.



### **PLANNING BOOM**

Council's planning team have experienced one of the busiest periods ever with a 28% increase in planning permit applications received from the previous financial year.

Of the 175 permit applications received 91% of the decisions where within the statutory timeframe. As a comparison Swan Hill received 196 planning permit applications.

In Gannawarra the planning applications equated to \$43.6m with Koondrook recording 18 applications for new dwellings.
