LEARNER DRIVER PROGRAM BACK ON THE ROAD

Placed on hiatus during the COVID-19 pandemic, the program helps learner drivers aged between 16 and 20 years gain the necessary 120 hours of driving experience needed to obtain a probationary licence.

SILAGE WRAP RECYCLING SERVICE

Local farmers can dispose of their silage wrap for free at Council's Cohuna Transfer Station.

To assist with the recycling of this product, silage wrap needs to be shaken and as clean as possible, and will be accepted in Bulka bags, wool bags or Plasback bags without net wrap or twine.

Silage wrap is made of a high quality linear lowdensity polyethylene plastic which is a wasted resource if sent to landfill.

Please note that burning silage wrap is illegal and it also releases harmful chemicals into the atmosphere.

The Cohuna Transfer Station is located at 150 Chuggs Road, Cohuna and is open 9am-11am Fridays and 1pm-4pm Sundays.

PROJECTS UPDATE



COHUNA WATERFRONT PROJECT COMPLETE

The transformation of Cohuna is complete, with the final stage of the Cohuna Waterfront Project finished in June.



Residents and visitors have provided positive feedback on works associated with Stage 2 of the project, which included the installation of a jetty on the banks of Gunbower Creek and new lighting.

Stage 2 of the Cohuna Waterfront Development formed part of the \$3.4 million Cohuna CBD and Waterfront Connections Project, supported by the State Government's \$2.7 billion Building Works package.

SUSTAINABLE RECREATIONAL WATER FOR QUAMBATOOK

The transformation of the Quambatook Weir Pool into a recreational oasis for residents and visitors will soon begin, with Earthwork Civil & Constructions awarded the tender to complete the \$1.53 million project.

Supported by a \$2.05 million contribution from the State Government's Regional Infrastructure Fund, the project involves isolating the Avoca River's flows at the Quambatook Weir Pool and installing infrastructure that connects this popular waterspot to the Quambatook township.

Key features include the development of a five-kilometre walking trail and pedestrian bridge crossing over the Avoca River between the township and the weir, as well as the installation of a jetty and boat ramp at the weir site.

Council will keep residents updated regarding the progress of this project via its website, Facebook page, *Gannawarra News* and future editions of *Gannawarra Connect*.

KERANG ALL ABILITIES PLAY SPACE

Construction of the Kerang All Abilities Play Space is nearing completion.

Located at Atkinson Park, this new space will be integrated into the current playground site, expanding the area to as far south as the sound shell.

Visitors are already benefiting from the recent installation of a fully accessible sway fun swing, with work to install in-ground trampolines, a log scramble area and water play areas continuing.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

VHM GOSCHEN PROJECT UPDATE

With Western Australia border restrictions eased, VHM Limited's Managing Director, Graham Howard was able to travel to Kerang in early June to meet with Gannawarra Shire Council and provide a status update on the Goschen Rare Earths and Mineral Sands Project and community engagement activities for 2022.

A wide range of technical studies have been undertaken in line with the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) Environment Effects Statement (EES) process. These studies assess and measure existing conditions which form the baseline from which potential impacts as a result of mining can be assessed. Some of the studies include air quality, noise, biodiversity, cultural heritage, landscape and visual, and traffic and transport.

These, and other studies, are currently being reviewed by the Technical Reference Group (TRG) – made up of representatives from a range of government departments and agencies, including Gannawarra Shire - to ensure all potential environmental impacts have been considered and addressed. Following TRG review, the findings from these studies, and the resulting environmental management commitments will be presented to the wider Gannawarra community.



VHM will host a number of drop-in information sessions across the region, commencing in late June. Community members are encouraged to attend to find out more about the technical studies and how they help refine the project. All feedback from community provides valuable input and forms part of the EES which is currently scheduled to be exhibited for public review in late 2022.

Information sessions are planned to be held in Lalbert and Kerang, and at other venues in the area. Keep an eye out for the roadshow schedule which will be advertised in local newspapers, on radio and <u>www.vhmltd.com.au</u>



VHM is also undertaking other activities in the region, including a metallurgical drilling program and airborne geophysical survey.

Currently there are three drill rigs in operation to obtain soil and mineral samples which are being sent to laboratories in Queensland for analysis. Further testing and refining is underway to ensure that soil layers and mineral properties are fully understood. For example, when mining is to commence, all topsoil would be carefully removed, then stored while mining takes place. On completion of mining, the pit would be filled with mine tailings, then the topsoil reinstated and conditioned to ensure cropping (pre-mining land-use) would continue. This is the key outcome of mine rehabilitation works.

The mineral samples are being analysed to ensure the mineral separation plant is designed and built to perform at optimal level.

The airborne geophysical survey work commencing in June is being undertaken in VHM's exploration lease areas to measure magnetic variations within the different rock types. This data is used to map the underlying geology which helps predict the location of minerals.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



KOONDROOK RETREAT AWARDS PUT THE GANNAWARRA ON THE MAP

Council's work to develop Koondrook Retreat into Victoria's nature based tourism destination was recognised by peak local government body, LGPro in June.

The retreat took out two awards at the 2022 LGPro Awards for Excellence - the Community Assets & Infrastructure (\$2.5 million and under) Initiative Award and Outstanding Small Rural Council Initiative Award.

Judges were impressed with high level of engagement Council undertook during the planning and construction of Koondrook Retreat, which opened in December 2020.

Council's work to transform Cohuna's Apex Park into a tourism and recreation hub for residents and visitors was also recognised, with the project - which included the creation of Cohuna Beach - highly commended in the Community Assets & Infrastructure (projects over \$2.5 million) Initiative category and a finalist in the Outstanding Small Rural Council Initiative Award.



URBAN GROWTH STRATEGY

Council is developing an Urban Growth Strategy to guide the future strategic directions for residential and industrial growth across the Gannawarra. This work will include an urban and regional demand analysis; completing an assessment of forecast population, housing and employment growth; undertake an assessment of the housing market and associated demand; complete a land supply audit of residential and industrial land; and prepare planning policy recommendations.

Growth in the Gannawarra has been backed up by two consecutive population increases, strong annual building figures, a high level of investment in the local economy and the development of new infrastructure that supports tourism and lifestyle choices.

To maximise future growth, new residential and industrial sites across the municipality needs to be identified to ensure that land supply doesn't restrict growth opportunities.

Around 80 new houses are built in the Gannawarra each year, highlighting the level of growth currently underway.

Industrial land sales are also very strong, with new developments proposed for Cohuna, Kerang and Koondrook.

Employment growth is strong, with around 450 jobs predicted in the short to medium term in mineral sands, manufacturing, agriculture and hospitality. Future growth in renewable energy will see KerangLink, along with other wind and solar projects, create around 1,000 construction jobs.

The development of the Urban Growth Strategy will generate developer confidence and maintain the high level of investment interest in the Gannawarra.
