DECLARATION OF BOATING ACTIVITY EXEMPTION

Gannawarra Shire Council, as the declared waterway manager for the waters of Lake Charm under the Marine Safety Act 2010 (Act), makes the following declaration under Section 203(3) of the Act. For the purposes of the boating activity by Ski Racing Victoria at Lake Charm vessels and persons participating in the Ski Racing Victoria 2017/2018 series of events detailed in **Table 1** are exempt from:

1. The requirements to operate a vessel at a speed not exceeding 5 knots within 50 metres of a person in the water, as detailed in Clause 2(a) of the Notice under Section 15(2) of the Marine Act 1988 (Vic);
2. The requirements to operate a vessel at a speed not exceeding 5 knots within 50 metres of another vessel, as detailed in Clause 2(c) of the Notice under Section 15(2) of the Marine Act 1988 (Vic);
3. The requirements of Clause 139.9(a)(b) of Schedule 139 (Lake Charm) in relation to the area prohibited to vessels (provided all vessels maintain a speed that minimizes wash when in this area).
4. The requirements of Regulations 96(6), 100(3), 101(3), 103, 104(1) and 104(2) of the Marine Safety Regulations 2012, in respect to the requirement to carry and wear a PFD for persons on board a vessel, requirement for persons being towed to wear a PFD, and requirement for master to ensure PFDs are worn. This exemption only applies to competing vessel occupants wearing a Lifeline Comp Vest PN170, and water-skiers wearing a Ski Racing Australia approved buoyant wetsuit.
5. The requirements of Regulation 96 (5) of the Marine Safety Regulations 2012, in respect to the requirement to carry a bucket with lanyard and waterproof buoyant torch. This applies to competing vessels only.

The exemptions apply for the times and dates listed in Table 1, provided that the stated safety controls and undertakings detailed in the Event Application and associated documentation are adhered to.

KERANG CBD WORKS UPDATE

Work is progressing on Victoria Street, albeit not as quickly as initially anticipated due to the level of attention required to lay the small carriageway pavers and difficulty in securing contractors. Council's priority is to have traffic flowing again as soon as possible (one way traffic initially), with the target date being this Monday 11 September. Products being used cure quickly, so once sealing and grouting of the paving is complete the road can be opened to traffic after 72 hours (as opposed to needing to cure for 21 days!). When the road reopens to traffic, large sections of the current temporary fence will be replaced with bollards and low fencing and works will begin on the western footpath section. The western footpath construction will involve the removal of all the pavers and sand along the footpath, and the concreting will be conducted in sections to maintain pedestrian access. Following removal of the pavers and sand, carpet has been laid on top of the crushed rock foundations and ramps constructed into shops. Pedestrian paths will change every few days while the concreting is taking place. It is anticipated that it may take up to 2 weeks to fully concrete all the different sections. The footpath paving will be much quicker than the roadway as they are larger and laid on a different product as they do not need to carry vehicular traffic. Works will be undertaken on weekends and outside business hours to minimise disruption as much as possible. The retaining walls are in production and will begin to be installed along the carriageway in the coming weeks. This will likely result in a full road closure over a number of Saturday afternoons to allow the segments to be lifted into position via a crane.

A reminder that Victoria Street is open for business as per normal! Parking is still available at either end of Victoria Street.
