KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS

Parents and guardians of children considering enrolling in Council's three-year-old and four-year-old kindergarten programs for 2022 are encouraged to complete an Expression of Interest as soon as possible to have access to round one applications.

As part of the 2022 enrolment process, families who complete an Expression of Interest by 5pm Friday, 30 July 2021 will receive an enrolment pack in mid-August, which includes a copy of the Gannawarra Shire Children's Services handbook and enrolment form.

To be eligible for four-year-old kindergarten, children must be turning four years of age before 30 April 2022; and to be eligible for three-year-old programs, children must be three years of age before 30 April 2022.

KERANG CBD REDEVELOPMENT

Council thanks residents, visitors and business owners for their patience following the resumption of the Kerang CBD Redevelopment – Stage 2.

Improvements along Scoresby Street between Fitzroy and Victoria streets are underway, with changes to pedestrian access at the corner of Scoresby and Victoria streets currently in place.

The improvements are part of the \$1.317 million project funded by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.
