## RECONCILIATION WALK TOMORROW

Residents will mark National Reconciliation Week with a walk through Kerang's streets tomorrow. Gannawarra Shire Council, Northern District Community Health, Mallee District Aboriginal Service and the Kerang Elders Group have united to organise a morning of events, highlighted by a walk from the Kerang Council Chambers at 10.00am to the Sir John Gorton Library. Festivities will begin with a flag raising ceremony outside the Kerang Council Chambers in Victoria Street, before local leaders and residents walk to the Sir John Gorton Library via Wellington, Fitzroy, Scoresby and Nolan streets. Events occurring at Kerang's library precinct will begin at 10.30am with Welcome to Country, followed by a smoking ceremony, story time featuring Tyipen Kwe performers and a free barbecue lunch.



## DENTAL VAN EXTENDS VISIT

The Royal Flying Doctor Dental Clinic, which has been based within the Gannawarra Shire since late February, will extend its visit to the area for a further three weeks. Initially scheduled to finish its three-month stay on Friday, 31 May, the service will remain within the Gannawarra until Wednesday, 19 June. The Royal Flying Doctor Dental Clinic will be located at RSL Drive, Kerang up to Friday, 7 June before returning to Apex Park, Koondrook from Tuesday, 11 June to Wednesday, 19 June. Those eligible to receive treatment are all children 17 years and under, adults aged 18 years and over who have a Health Care or Pensioner Concession card, all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, and all refugees and asylum seekers. ## GANNAWARRA CARES PUBLICATION

A new publication is providing details regarding what services and support are available during the ongoing dry conditions and other issues that are impacting local farming, small businesses and the wider community.

The first edition of *Gannawarra Cares* is being distributed widely, and will start to appear in community newsletters, social media, at rural supply networks and other outlets across the Gannawarra Shire.

Scheduled to be produced monthly, *Gannawarra Cares* has been developed by the Gannawarra Resilience Committee, which includes representatives from 21 agencies, including Gannawarra Shire Council, health and community support providers, the agricultural sector and emergency services. The debut edition features details on the Gannawarra Giving Account, funding opportunities and support services.
