






Ambulance Victoria suggest considering the following items when purchasing an AED:










# Maintenance and storage of an AED

Once an organisation has purchased an AED, Ambulance Victoria recommends the following processes for its regular maintenance and storage:

#### **Maintenance**










## Storage





The AED should be clearly signed with an approved AED wall sign.

It is recommended the AED is not locked up. There are a range of wall-mounted storage cabinets and devices that can be purchased, some including alarm functions.

Organisation members and regular visitors should be informed of the location of the AED.

AED owners may wish to notify surrounding facilities and groups that there is one on the premises that is available during specified hours.

### Registration

After purchasing your AED, Ambulance Victoria strongly encourages you to register it at <a href="www.ambulance.vic.gov.au/register">www.ambulance.vic.gov.au/register</a>.

This will assist in providing fast and easy access to the AED in the event of a medical emergency.



If your AED is registered and used to help save a life, Ambulance Victoria will replace the electrode pads free of charge.
