Leitchille & District Community Plan

The Leitchville & District Community Plan 2024-2029 sets out the community's vision for the next six years. Developed and owned by the community, the plan captures the community's voice for what is most important for them.

Community planning commenced in January 2023 and was completed in September 2023. Community members in and around Leitchville & District were invited to share their input into the planning process via a variety of methods:



The Leitchville & District Community Plan is a community owned plan that captures community aspirations across a broad range of areas (not just local government). This project was delivered with funding from the Agriculture-Dependent Community Resilience Project.


Our District

Community Consultation

Residents living in Leitchville & District were invited to share their thoughts on the strengths, challenges and opportunities for their community.

A range of strategies were selected from to ensure as many community members as possible could inform the development of the Leitchville & District Community Plan. Strategies included: an online and hard copy survey, community workshop, a listening post, a focus group, children's drawing activities and attendance at a community social meal.

The following broad community engagement was achieved:

- > 40 people filled in a survey
- > 27 key stakeholders and community members attended a community workshop
- > 13 people attended a social meal
- > 10 people attended a listening post
- ▶ 8 children and adults participated in a focus group at the school
- > 6 children completed a drawing exercise.

Overall, a total of 104 people shared their thoughts, ideas and dreams for the future of Leitchville & District.

LEITCHVILLE & DISTRICTS' STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS AND KEY ACTIONS:

1: TOWN BEAUTIFICATION AND SIGNAGE

- **1.** Beautify town entrances and ensure good town signage.
- **2.** Beautify streetscapes and install more seating in the main street.
- **3.** Upgrade walking/cycling track signage.
- **4.** Seek funding for the installation of public space artworks.
- **5.** Work together with owners to address unsightly buildings and sites.

2: ACCESSIBLE, INCLUSIVE, SAFE AND WELL-MAINTAINED COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE

- Activate the masterplan to develop the sporting precinct; prioritising a lighting upgrade and women's change rooms.
- 2. Maintain and improve roads ensuring that they safely support residents, visitors and agriculture needs and equipment.
- 3. Restore the Lions Park at Kow Swamp so it can be used again for swimming, picnics and BBQs.
- **4.** Upgrade the community pool and extend opening hours.
- $oldsymbol{5}$. Explore opportunities for service co-location at the Rural Transaction Centre.
- **6.** Maintain and enhance walking and cycling tracks and trails.
- **7.** Maintain and plan for footpaths that better support ageing community members.
- 8. Improve and maintain play spaces for children and install play equipment suitable for older children.
- **9.** Increase recreation infrastructure and opportunities for children and young people e.g. explore developing the old tennis court to include a pump track/skate park, exercise equipment and basketball court.

3: A HEALTHY, CONNECTED AND SERVICED COMMUNITY

- $oldsymbol{1}$. Offer social activities, programs and events that strengthen community spirit, inclusion and connections.
- **2.** Support initiatives that strengthen connections between neighbours.
- **3.** Offer more events, programs and activities focussed around arts and culture.
- 4. Advocate for adequate GP, emergency care, chemist services and health and wellbeing and aged care service access.
- **5.** Offer local school holiday programs/activities for children.
- $oldsymbol{6}.$ Work with health services to provide more local activities and programs for older residents.
- **7.** Support key community services- kindergarten, primary school and library service.
- **8.** Seek funding for video conferencing equipment for the Leitchville Rural Transaction Centre.

4: SUPPORT, RESOURCE AND REDUCE WORKLOAD ON VOLUNTEERS

- 1. Adopt contemporary and flexible volunteering approaches to actively encourage new volunteers, especially younger and new residents.
- **2.** Seek advocacy support from Council to support volunteer sustainability.

5: PROMOTE AND CELEBRATE HISTORY AND HERITAGE AND NATURAL ENVIRONMENT

- **1.** Protect and maintain local heritage.
- 2. Explore ways to promote and celebrate local history and heritage, including farming and irrigation history.
- **3.** Promote Aboriginal history.
- **4.** Promote our natural assets and opportunities for passive recreation such as fishing, bird watching, photography, rock climbing etc.

1: A GREAT PLACE TO VISIT

- **1.** Enhance and promote tourism in Leitchville & District.
- **2.** Develop and promote natural environmental assets e.g. Mount Hope, Kow Swamp and Gunbower Island.
- **3.** Develop a Mount Hope nature walk.
- 4. Investigate opportunities for enhancing Kow Swamp- a viewing platform and visitor information centre.
- **5.** Develop a walking/cycle track out to Kow Swamp.
- $\pmb{6}$. Promote and develop the Leitchville Travellers Rest (caravan free camp area).
- **7.** Promote photography of the natural environment.
- **8.** Investigate the opportunity to become a part of the canoe trail.

2: A STRONG LOCAL ECONOMY

- 1. Attract local business and industry that will build the local economy and increase employment.
- **2.** Actively explore opportunities for developing the old cheese factory site.
- **3.** Explore social enterprise opportunities that can boost local employment for residents and young people.
- **4.** Encourage agricultural development and advocate for the needs of the agricultural sector.
- **5.** Explore fuel depot opportunities/schemes/models that could offer a local fuel supply.
- 6. Promote businesses in Leitchville & District and strengthen the 'buy/support local' culture.
- **7.** Advocate for improved mobile phone and internet services for Leitchville & District.

3: POPULATION STABILITY/GROWTH

- 1. Undertake town planning to identify and plan for future town growth/residential development.
- **2.** Work together with Gannawarra Shire Council to increase available housing blocks in Leitchville & District.
- **3.** Promote the primary school and grow student enrolments.
- **4.** Explore opportunities to capitalise on remote/hybrid working trends.
- **5.** Promote the liveability of Leitchville & District.



Achieve long-term financial and environmental sustainability.

LEITCHVILLE & DISTRICTS' STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS AND KEY ACTIONS:

1: INCREASED RENEWABLE ENERGY

1. Investigate community solar schemes that could support community members to increase their use of renewable energy.

2: PROTECT AND IMPROVE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT

- 1. Maintain trees and control weeds on Council, Crown and Private Land.
- **2.** Protect natural environmental assets, e.g. Kow Swamp, Mount Hope, Gunbower Island.

3: PREPARE AND RESPOND TO A CHANGING CLIMATE

- 1. Build community resilience and reduce the vulnerability of communities to extreme weather events (fire, flood and heat).
- **2.** Offer community education on emergency risks and how to prepare.

4: WASTE REDUCTION

- **1.** Explore ways to reduce household and business waste.
- **2.** Advocate for a yearly hard rubbish collection.
- **3.** Advocate for green waste collection.
- **4.** Apply for Leitchville to be the Recycling Depot location for the Container Deposit Scheme.
- **5.** Adopt circular economy principles and systems to reduce waste and landfill.

Putting Our Plan Into Action

Implementation of the Leitchville & District Community Plan will be led by the Leitchville Progress Association in partnership with Gannawarra Shire Council.

Community members and relevant key community stakeholders will be invited to inform projects and activities and work together on shared priorities. Yearly progress updates on community priorities and activities will be provided to the wider community.
