

KERANG CBD REDEVELOPMENT WORKS CONTINUE

Work associated with Stages 3 and 4 of the Kerang CBD Redevelopment will begin in February.

Fully funded thanks to the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, improvements will occur along Wellington Street between Nolan and Albert streets, Fitzroy Street between Scoresby and Wellington streets, and Victoria Street between Scoresby Street and the Walkers IGA car park.

Works will include replacing existing paved surfaces with materials used throughout the Kerang CBD sections of Scoresby and Victoria streets, installing new street furniture and landscaping, and improving lighting around the Karlie McDonald Memorial Clock to enhance this iconic memorial.

KEEP RECYCLING YOUR HOUSEHOLD GLASS BOTTLES

Residents are encouraged to continue taking their household glass bottles to any of Council's transfer stations at Cohuna, Kerang, Lalbert and Quambatook, as well as the Koondrook depot, for recycling.

Not only are all bottles handed in for recycling turned into new products such as roads and construction material, this process reduces instances where contents from yellow household recycling bins are redirected to landfill due to broken glass materials.

SMALL-SCALE ENERGY FACILITIES PROPOSED

Council has approved a Kig Energy proposal to construct small-scale solar energy generation facilities at the Kerang Aerodrome and Kerang Transfer Station.

As part of the proposal, a 4.99megawatt solar generation facility incorporating a 5megawatt battery storage unit would be built at the Kerang Aerodrome.

The proposal also includes the installation of a 1-megawatt solar generation facility incorporating a 1-megawatt battery storage unit at the Kerang Transfer Station.

Council has been working with Kig Energy since 2019 to identify suitable locations for these projects, with a proposal to lease a 12-hectare parcel of land within the Kerang Aerodrome approved in July 2020.

Council will enter into a formal agreement between Council and Kig Energy, which is to be developed and approved at a future Council Meeting.

The facilities are also designed to provide cheaper electricity options for residents and community groups, which is achieved by avoiding network transmission costs.



COHUNA'S NEW PUBLIC DEFIBRILLATOR

Cohuna residents and visitors are benefiting from the recent installation of a 24hour publicly accessible automated external defibrillator (AED) at the Gateway to Gannawarra Visitor Centre.

Made possible thanks to Ambulance Victoria's gifting program, the AED will benefit anyone who needs this potentially lifesaving assistance within Cohuna's central business district, at Garden Park, Apex Park or at the Gateway itself.

As part of the donation, the Gateway to Gannawarra Visitor Centre has also hosted sessions enabling residents to lean how to use an AED.

RESIDENTIAL HOUSING OPTIONS EXPLORED

Residential housing availability is currently a national issue, with Council playing its role in attracting new developers to the area.

Council has been working with national development company, Wel.Co regarding a proposed 350-lot residential development in Cohuna.

"We have been impressed with the high level of development and growth in the Gannawarra Shire and we see serious opportunities to provide new residential options," Wel.Co Chief Executive Officer, Andrew Welsh said.

Other accommodation projects are being considered for Kerang, Koondrook and Quambatook to capitalise on development proposals.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

VNI WEST COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT CONTINUES

Council is encouraging landowners who have questions regarding the VNI West electricity transmission project to contact Transmission Company Victoria (TCV), which now has an regional office based in Patchell Plaza, Kerang

TCV representatives have held regular meetings with Gannawarra landowners wanting to know more about the project and the two-kilometre wide corridor the proposed transmission infrastructure will be built on.

"There have been several key farming issues resolved by landowners working with TCV staff and consultants, and we will assist any landowners seeking solutions with TCV," Council's Executive Manager Economic Development, Roger Griffiths said.

KOORANGIE ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEM DISCUSSIONS

Edify Energy recently held an information session regarding the Koorangie Energy Storage System.

To be built at Sandhill Lake, the \$400 million project involves the construction of a lithium-ion battery that will



connect to the 220kV transmission network that currently passes through the Gannawarra and provide system strength to the Murray River Renewable Energy Zone.

Edify Energy already has a strong presence in the Gannawarra, thanks to the Gannawarra Solar Farm and Energy Storage System, which has been in operation since 2018.

TELSTRA 3G NETWORK CLOSING 30 JUNE 2024

Council is working with mobile phone providers to improve connectivity in readiness for the closure of the Telstra 3G (third generation) network on 30 June 2024.

Residents whose mobile phones are only 3G compliant are urged to upgrade their device to one that is 4G or 5G compliant, with rural residents requested to check their on-farm monitoring devices to ensure they are 4G or 5G compliant.

Businesses that provide eftpos for purchasing will also be impacted, with owners encouraged to speak to their bank to check that their devices are 4G or 5G compliant.

Similar changes are also planned for the Optus network, which is shutting down its 3G network in September 2024. Vodafone has already shut down its 3G network, which occurred in December 2023.

Meanwhile, Council continues to advocate for the installation of a mobile phone reception tower at Benjeroop, which would build on recent tower upgrades at Lalbert, Lake Meran and Sandhill Lake, as well as the introduction of 5G services at Kerang and Koondrook/Barham.

GANNAWARRA REFLECTIONS - ONE YEAR ON VIDEO

Council and Northern District Community Health have partnered to develop the *Gannawarra Reflections - One Year On* video, which highlights how communities across the Gannawarra are recovering from the October-December 2022 floods.

The video builds on the development of a seven-video series in early 2023 that highlighted how residents from communities throughout the municipality were impacted by the floods and how their communities responded.

Filming occurred over a two-day period during November 2023 at various locations, including Cohuna, Kerang, Koondrook, Murrabit, Quambatook, Reedy Lake and Tragowel.

Funding of the video was supported by the Victorian and Commonwealth Governments under the Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) as part of the Gannawarra Community Flood Recovery Program.

FLOOD-DAMAGED ROAD REPAIRS CONTINUE

Work to repair the more than 1,000 kilometres of roads damaged by the October-December 2022 flood continues.

Council is working to receive approval under the joint Commonwealth and State Government funded Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements to begin repairs associated with the final 12 road repair packages, valued at more than \$8 million.

The approval process is time consuming, with Council required to take photographs at 100-metre intervals and submit this and other evidence.

Council will provide regular updates once these works begin via its website, Facebook page and *Gannawarra News*. These updates will include any changes to traffic conditions, which will be undertaken to ensure minimal disruption for residents in affected areas.

WERE YOU AFFECTED BY THE CHRISTMAS DAY, EARLY JANUARY RAIN?

Council's Flood Recovery Support Team is aiming to contact all residents who have had homes, infrastructure or business property damaged by the Christmas Day, 2 January and 7-8 January storm and flooding events.
