One of Council's major documents, the 2023/2024 Budget - adopted at the June 2023 Council Meeting - outlines how Council will maintain current services, support projects and invest in initiatives that will continue to make the Gannawarra a great place to live.

The major highlight of the 2023/2024 Budget is a record capital works program, which includes \$25 million to repair Council-managed roads damaged by last year's floods to a pre-flood standard.



KERANG CBD REDEVELOPMENT -STAGE 3 UPDATE

Improvements to the central business district of Victoria Street, Kerang continue, with Stage 3 of the Kerang CBD Redevelopment on track for completion by December 2023.

Visitors to businesses along the eastern section of Victoria Street between Scoresby Street and Victoria Square are benefiting from recently completed works, including raising the height of the pathway and eliminating the need for steps at the entrance to each business. These improvements will complement the remodeling of car parking spaces along this section, enabling easier access for pedestrians.

Work will soon begin on improving paved surfaces along the eastern section of Victoria Street between Victoria Square and Wellington Street to tie this area in with already completed improvements. Residents and visitors are advised that access to footpaths and parking spaces will be impacted by these works, with Council aiming for minimal disruptions.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

VNI WEST AREA OF INTEREST UPDATE

Council is working with landowners located in VNI West's area of interest following a recently announced realignment of the project's proposed route.

The Australian Energy Market Operator (AEMO), in consultation with the State Government, has revised the proposed route for the 500-kilovolt double-circuit overhead transmission line that will connect key electricity infrastructure projects near Stawell in Victoria and Jerilderie in New South Wales. This new route now covers the southwestern part of the Gannawarra Shire and a corridor of land north of Kerang, with further engagement to occur to narrow VNI West's confirmed route.

The project also involves construction of a new electricity sub-station near Kerang, with a location still to be determined.

Council has worked with landowners and investors during the past decade regarding renewable energy projects within the Gannawarra, many of which cannot proceed without the development of VNI West. Council is also committed to helping landowners located within VNI West's areas of interest, including providing information and coordinating meetings with AEMO to discuss issues around timing of works and appropriate compensation.

Once completed, VNI West will open up billions of dollars of investment opportunities, create thousands of construction jobs in the years to come and potentially bringing in millions of dollars to our Council in future Payment in Lieu of Rate payments, which will benefit all residents.

DRAFT GANNAWARRA URBAN GROWTH STRATEGY

Thank you to everyone who took the time in May and June to read the *Draft Gannawarra Urban Growth Strategy*.

This important document will help support the future rezoning of residential and industrial land in Cohuna, Kerang, the Kerang Lakes and Koondrook to cater for forecast population growth

FLOOD RECOVERY

FLOOD INQUIRY SUBMISSION CONTINUES ADVOCACY EFFORTS

Council recently provided a submission to the Parliamentary Inquiry into the 2022 Flood Event.

Developed with input from residents impacted by the floods, the Gannawarra Community Recovery Committee, flood observers and Council staff, the document outlines how the October-December 2022 flood event affected residents and suggests ways response efforts can be improved.

The document features 37 recommendations covering the nine inquiry terms of reference topics, including what factors caused or contributed to the flood event, the adequacy and effectiveness of early warning systems, resourcing of emergency services, government policy, flood mitigation strategies, and the Victorian planning framework's implications for future planning decisions.

The development of the submission has played an important role in the Gannawarra's recovery process by enabling residents the opportunity to tell their story and more importantly, put forward solutions to mitigate future flood risk.

RURAL LEVEE BANK REPAIR REQUIREMENTS

Levees in rural areas of Gannawarra Shire are not under any formal management arrangements and there is no obligation on any landowner or agency, including Council, to maintain them.

A permit is required to repair a levee bank on Crown Land. This can be obtained by phoning North Central Catchment Management Authority (NCCMA) on (03) 5440 1896.

Council and NCCMA have been made aware of works on private land that occurred during and after the recent flood event and will be working with landowners to ensure they gain the necessary approvals or remove the works if they have the potential to adversely affect neighbouring properties.

FLOOD RECOVERY



FLOOD ROAD REPAIRS CONTINUE THROUGHOUT THE GANNAWARRA

Efforts to repair Council-managed flood-damaged roads continue, with work expected to take 12-18 months to complete.

More than 1,000 kilometres of roads were damaged by the October-December 2022 floods, with Council developing 12 works packages supported by joint Commonwealth and State Government Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements to ensure repairs are completed to a pre-flood standard.

The first package of works was recently completed, focusing on roads at Horfield, Macorna North, Mincha and Mincha West. These works including grading road surfaces and resheeting areas where road surfaces were washed away.

Regular updates regarding flood repair works will be provided via Council's website, *Gannawarra News, Gannawarra Connect* and Council's Facebook page.

COMMUNITY FLOOD RECOVERY GRANTS PROGRAM

Gannawarra Shire-based community groups have until Monday, 31 July to apply for funding from the Gannawarra Community Flood Recovery Grants Program.

This new grants program will provide up to \$3,000 for not-for-profit community groups based in the Gannawarra to support a variety of small activities that promote social connectedness and mental health and wellbeing across flood impacted communities.

Community groups are encouraged to look at the program guidelines, which are available at www.gsc.vic.gov.au/grants, and determine whether their project ideas fit within the funding criteria.

Projects that are successful in obtaining funding will be required to have clear outcomes for residents and communities impacted by the flood event and must be completed on or before 31 March 2024.

GANNAWARRA MUNICIPAL FLOOD RECOVERY PLAN RELEASED

The Gannawarra Municipal Flood Recovery Plan is leading the municipality's recovery from the October-December 2022 floods.

Developed thanks to input from two flood-related committees – the Gannawarra Community Flood Recovery Committee and the Gannawarra Municipal Recovery Committee – and three sub-committees focusing on themes associated with wellbeing and social recovery; built and natural environment; and agriculture and economic recovery, the plan features 48 priority actions across 11 recovery target areas that Council and other agencies will work on to guide recovery efforts.
