HELP SHAPE THE CONNECTING GANNAWARRA PROJECT

Residents living in six communities are encouraged to work with Council to develop community plans that reflect their uniqueness and priorities.

Funded by the Agriculture-Dependent Community Resilience Project, the *Connecting Gannawarra* project will build on community planning work undertaken since 2008 and will empower communities to plan for their future whilst building resilience.

Project facilitators will work with residents from the Lakes

District, Lalbert, Leitchville, Macorna/Tragowel, Murrabit/Myall/Benjeroop, and Quambatook during the first half of 2023 to develop these community plans, with various options to participate available.

RECYCLE YOUR E-WASTE AT COUNCIL'S TRANSFER STATIONS

Residents who have everyday electrical products that need to be disposed of can take these items to their local transfer station for recycling for free.

Anything that has a plug, battery or cord that is no longer of use is classified as ewaste, and cannot be disposed of in your household rubbish bin. This includes televisions, DVD players, computer monitors, printers, microwaves, portable heaters and fans.

More than 4,852 kilograms worth of e-waste materials was collected via Council's transfer stations at Cohuna, Kerang, Lalbert and Quambatook in 2021/22, diverting these items from landfill and ensuring these products were made into new items.

ELECTORAL STRUCTURE REVIEW

Residents are encouraged to have their say on the Victorian Electoral Commission's preliminary report into Gannawarra Shire Council's electoral structure.

The Minister for Local Government has called for the review of the electoral structure of 39 local councils, including Gannawarra Shire, which are currently not consistent with the requirements of the *Local Government Act 2020*.

The review will determine whether Gannawarra Shire Council has an appropriate number of Councillors and whether the municipality should be one large unsubdivided area or subdivided into wards.

ANIMAL REGISTRATION RENEWALS

Animal registration renewal notices have been distributed to pet owners throughout the Gannawarra.

As outlined in the *Domestic Animals Act 1994,* all dogs and cats over three months of age must be



registered with their local Council and microchipped.

Reduced registration fees are applicable for pets aged over 10 years; dogs kept for working stock; animals that are registered with an Applicable Organisation; and animals that are desexed.

Payment can be made in person at Council's Customer Service Centres, by cheque or money order mailed to Council, over the phone by phoning (03) 5450 9333 or online via BPAY. A separate BPAY payment is required per animal.

WATERSPORTS RETURN TO THE GANNAWARRA

Ski racing action returned to Kangaroo Lake and Lake Charm in January and February after the October-December 2022 floods impacted Ski Racing Victoria's Point Score Series schedule.

Kangaroo Lake hosted event 3 of the Point Score series on 28-29 January, attracting 217 entries. Similar numbers attended the Point Score 4 competition, also held at Kangaroo Lake on 11-12 February, as well as the Point Score 5 competition held at Lake Charm on 25-26 February.

Many of the teams that competed used these meets as warm-ups for the Southern 80 Ski Race, occurring at Echuca on 24-26 March.

Council continues to work on promoting the Kerang Lakes area as an ideal place for watersports events, which provides flow-on benefits to accommodation providers and hospitality businesses.

HOUSING DEMAND

Council's Economic Development team continues to work with developers regarding residential development options in the Gannawarra.

With renewable energy projects and the VHM Minerals project at Goschen predicted to generate hundreds of jobs, there is strong demand for additional housing for new residents.

FLOOD RECOVERY

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR FLOOD-AFFECTED FARMERS

Flood-affected farmers are eligible to apply before 4pm Sunday, 30 April 2023 for financial support via the current Agriculture Victoria flood recovery grants program. Available grants include:

- Primary Producer Recovery Grants: Up to \$75,000 grants to cover the cost of recovery and get businesses up and running again. Note: This replaces the \$10,000 Primary Producer Flood Clean–Up, Relief Grants announced on 19 October 2022. Producers that have received a Primary Producer Flood Clean–Up Relief Grant of \$10,000 can now apply for up to a further \$65,000 under the Primary Producer Recovery Grant, bringing the total to \$75,000.
- **Rural Landholder Grants:** Up to \$25,000 grants to cover the costs of disaster impacts for small-scale producers.
- **Primary Producer Concessional Loans:** Up to \$250,000 to restore or replace damaged equipment and infrastructure, or to cover short-term business expenses.
- **Primary Producer Transport Subsidies:** Up to \$15,000 to support the transport of emergency fodder or stock drinking water, and the movement of livestock.

Windermere Services continues to assist Council in providing additional support to residents impacted by the October-December 2022 floods.

Secondary impact



assessments on private residences damaged by the floods are continuing, which helps determine what assistance each resident needs.

Residents who have not yet registered with Council for flood recovery assistance, can do so by contacting Council on (03) 5450 9333 during business hours.

Meanwhile, secondary impact assessments are also occurring on Councilmanaged infrastructure damaged by the floods, such as roads, levees and bridges. These assessments also include recommended actions that need to be undertaken, such as repairs or requesting follow-up inspections by specialists. This data will assist Council in advocating for additional funding from the Federal and State governments.

COMMUNITY COMMITTEE ASSISTING WITH FLOOD RECOVERY

The Gannawarra Community Flood Recovery Committee recently held its first meeting, enabling community members from impacted areas across the Shire to come together to discuss the flood situation and provide guidance on priorities they would like to see implemented to help their communities recover from the floods.

The committee is also assisting with the development of the Gannawarra Flood Recovery Action Plan, which will ensure recovery efforts are undertaken in a coordinated, effective and timely manner.
