NEW COUNCIL ELECTED

Six Councillors and one returning Councillor make up the Gannawarra Shire Council for 2020-2024 following Local Government elections, held in October.

The results of the 2020 Gannawarra Shire Council election were confirmed in mid-November, with the new Councillors sworn in on 16 November.

Charlie Gillingham was the only candidate to nominate in the Avoca Ward, with Keith Link and Garner Smith (Yarran Ward), Ross Stanton (Murray Ward) and Kelvin Burt, Travis Collier and Jane Ogden (Patchell Ward) elected.

Former Mayors, Brian Gibson and Lorraine Learmonth, as well as Jodie Basile and Andrew Gibbs did not seek re-election. Jenny Fawcett and Steve Tasker were unsuccessful in seeking re-election

YOUR NEW COUNCILLORS


YARRAN WARD

PATCHELL WARD

Three new Councillors were elected to represent the Patchell Ward, which covers Kerang, Macorna and Tragowel.



Current Kerang Progress Association President, **Kelvin Burt** was the first successful candidate.

Victoria Police Community Engagement Officer, **Travis Collier** was also elected, receiving the second highest number of votes.





Former Gannawarra Shire Council staff member, Jane Ogden was also elected.

Mr Burt, Mr Collier and Ms Ogden replace former Mayor Brian Gibson and Jodie Basile, who both did not seek re-election, and Jenny Fawcett, who was unsuccessful in seeking reelection.

Kerang business owner, Rodney Hibbet; schoolteacher, Paul Donovan; and former Avoca Ward representative, Neil Gannon also stood for election in this ward.

LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

Council has funded two leadership programs through the Federal Government's Drought Communities Funding - Extension.

More than 25 local residents recently participated in *the Gannawarra Conversation*, meeting online twice to brainstorm some big picture ideas for the Gannawarra, which included:

- A self-drive tour of Gannawarra using augmented reality so that stories come to life (eg. parks and gardens, heritage, art);
- Promoting our assets Agriculture, Lifestyle and Nature-based tourism;
- Creating a dedicated youth space; and
- Encouraging entrepreneurship and creative business development such as online platform for promotion of local producers and creatives.

The Gannawarra Community Resilience Committee, which consists of 28 agencies, looks forward to continuing to work with the community to explore these ideas further.

Council is also a partner in the Make a Change Australia's Let's Pivot Leadership Program. Participation is free for Gannawarra residents with the program delivered fully online through to 31 March

GANNAWARRA SAY NO TO FAMILY VIOLENCE

Council and local agencies have worked in partnership for a number of years on an annual Gannawarra Goes Orange campaign to raise awareness of family violence.

This year, due to COVID-19 restrictions, activities led by the Gannawarra Free from Violence Working Group will focus on a media campaign and include the development of a localised video clip, radio and print advertising and banner and flag displays in prominent locations.

The key messages will be 'Gannawarra Says No to Family Violence' and 'Respect Women – Call It Out'.



In addition, banners will be displayed in prominent public locations and the Kerang Council Chambers will be lit up orange.

The Gannawarra Goes Orange campaign will take place between 25 November and 10 December and forms part of a statewide campaign as part of the 16 Days of Activism against Family Violence.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



KOONDROOK RETREAT SET TO OPEN

Work on the Koondrook Retreat is close to completion, with several small outdoor jobs to be completed prior to the facility being officially opened.

The facility comprises six self-contained safari tents set along Gunbower Creek, and are able to sleep five people.



Koondrook Retreat will be managed by industry professionals who have expertise in tourism, marketing and product development, with Council awarding the successful team a two-year contract following an Expression of Interest process.

Once confirmed, the opening will be a public event. Details will be promoted via Council's website and Facebook pages.

MAJOR PROJECTS CONTINUING

Council plays a key role in diversifying the local economy. At present, there are a range of projects proposed that will generate significant employment during the next four years:

VHM Mineral Sands—The VHM mineral sands project at Lalbert is hoping to commence in 2021. A wide range of regulatory work has been undertaken behind the scenes and VHM is working with Council on a range of infrastructure options. The project is likely to create around 250 jobs over a 30-year period and have a huge impact on the local economy.

New Irrigation Project—While many people are experiencing the impacts of a tight water market, some opportunists are investing in new projects aimed at increasing the capacity of irrigated agriculture in the Gannawarra. Calum Peace has a 6,000-acre project with 40 centre pivots and a 1000-acre vineyard south west of Kangaroo Lake. This type of investment will create up to 40 jobs, especially around harvest times, and showcase the area for further investment in agriculture.

OTHER WORKS

Below is a list of projects underway or under consideration:

- Development of a new piggery at Kerang East is underway.
- Several new poultry projects are in the process of securing property.
- A new \$40 million medicinal cannabis facility in Tate Drive, Kerang is under consideration.
- Cohuna Waterfront development works are underway.
- The renovation of the Koondrook Railway Goods Shed continues.
- Staff are working with a developer regarding an accommodation project in Cohuna.
- Stage 9 of the Tate Drive Industrial Estate, Kerang will commence in early 2021, with several new business development opportunities.
- A 17-lot unit development at Murray Sound, Cohuna is being considered.
- A 5MW micro grid for Kerang is proposed.
- A company seeking land for the construction of three 5MW solar farms.
- Council has received interest in a large wind energy project.
- There is interest in developing a large truck stop and transport facility on the Murray Valley Highway in Kerang
- Several new retail businesses in Kerang have opened in the past two months.

MAJOR PROJECT FUND

Applications are now open for Council's Major Community Project Fund.

A total of \$250,000, allocated in Council's 2020/21 Budget, is available for community groups, organisations and clubs to apply for infrastructure projects on non-Council owned or controlled land. Examples of such land may include recreation reserves, sporting facilities, community halls and playgrounds on crown land or land managed by other agencies or community groups.

Applications will be considered for community, sport and recreation infrastructure projects, with funding of between \$10,000 and \$125,000 per project available.

Funding preference will be given to projects that have confirmed funding from external grants, or other sources, and/or an in-kind contribution.

Applications close at 5pm on Tuesday, 19 January 2021.
