COUNCILS' #PUSHBACKBUYBACK CAMPAIGN CALLS TO STOP WATER BUYBACKS

The Murray River Group of Councils - which Gannawarra Shire Council is a member of - recently launched the #PushBackBuyBack campaign, which call for the Federal Government to halt plans to resume using buyback processes to seek additional water for environmental use across the Murray-Darling Basin.

As part of the campaign, full-page advertisements calling for the Federal Government to reconsider its stance on the issue were published in *The Age* and *Sydney Morning Herald*, with media promoting the campaign sent to more than 300 local, regional and national media contacts.

WHAT IS THE MURRAY-DARLING BASIN PLAN?

Signed into law in November 2012, the Murray-Darling Basin Plan is an agreement between the Federal Government and the State Governments the Murray-Darling Basin covers that determines how the water that flows through the Basin is managed to ensure its long-term health.

Irrigation farming is a key driver of the local economy. In 1995, when water trading commenced, the local area held around 340,000 megalitres of water rights. The impacts of trading, drought and government buybacks has seen this figure reduced by around 46 per cent. Further buy backs will see food costs increase as irrigation is reduced.

Since the implementation of the Murray-Darling Basin Plan, Council has worked to diversify the municipality's agricultural sector, with medicinal cannabis, free range poultry and eggs, intensive animal developments, mining and renewable energy projects developed.

FLOOD RECOVERY

FLOOD-DAMAGED ROAD REPAIRS CONTINUE

Work to repair the more than 1,000 kilometres of roads damaged by the October-December 2022 flood continues.

Council recently awarded the tenders for the final eight road repair packages, valued at more than \$3.1 million, with approval to proceed with these improvements, as well as work associated with the third of these repair packages, dependent on approval from the Department of Transport.

The approval process is time consuming, with Council required to take photographs at 100-metre intervals and submit this and other evidence to meet the requirements under the joint Commonwealth and State Government funded Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.



Once works are ready to commence in the coming months, regular updates will be provided to the community informing of any disruption to the road and drainage networks in advance, whilst ensuring appropriate traffic management is in place to minimise disruptions.

ONE YEAR ON FLOOD RECOVERY PROGRAM

As part of the Gannawarra One Year On Flood Recovery program, Council is working with numerous agencies and residents across the Gannawarra Shire to acknowledge the anniversary of the 2022 floods. This includes a One Year On Reflection video, featuring residents who appeared in the seven-part *Gannawarra Reflections* series of videos on the October-December 2022 flood event as they reflect on the previous twelve months.

A call out will soon be made for a One Year On exhibition that will feature photography, digital material and art. Occurring in March 2024, this exhibition will enable the collection of flood material from across the Gannawarra Shire to be collected, showcased and then retained to document key learnings to inform future flood planning and record historical information as part of the Gannawarra Library Service's collection so that it is available for future generations. Drone footage of the environment is also being captured One Year On in similar locations to drone footage captured during the floods.

A family event will also be held in partnership with Kerang Traders on Friday, 17 November in the Kerang CBD This event aims to showcase the continued community spirit and to support the business sector who were also impacted by the floods.
