ACCOLADES FOR MAJOR PROJECTS

Council congratulates the architects of two major projects completed within the Gannawarra on winning major national and international awards.

The architects responsible for the Koondrook Wharf, Terroir has won the Urban Planning/Landscape Architecture title in the 2019 Chicago Athenaeum/European Design for Architecture Art and Urban Design Studies Awards for the project. Award winners were announced last month, with the \$2 million wharf project recognised alongside building and public spaces located throughout the globe. Hansen Partnership has also been awarded for its work with the \$1.158 million Victoria Square, Kerang redevelopment, winning a Good Design Award in the Architectural Design category.

The award jury praised the project, stating the area "has been reinvigorated as a place that elicits civic pride and promotes community use", congratulating Council, the community and the project designers for undertaking a long engagement process to find an appropriate urban design

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Council welcomed the recent report from the Australian Energy Market Operator, which recommends significant upgrades to the major electricity line that passes through the Gannawarra.

Council has worked both independently and with the Murray River Group of Councils to advocate for these works to occur, which have the potential to be a game changer for renewable energy investment in the municipality. Council looks forward to working with AEMO as it conducts a Regulatory Investment Test for Transmission for what it has called KerangLink.

Cr Steve Tasker and I (pictured), had the honour of attending the Lexus Melbourne Cup Tour's recent visit to Koondrook.

This is another event that has put the Gannawarra on the map, with the tour visiting 52 communities across China, England, Japan, New Zealand, Singapore and Australia prior to the Melbourne Cup on the first Tuesday in November.
