REGISTER YOUR BURN-OFF

Residents are reminded to register their burn-off with the Emergency Services Telecommunications Authority. This is to ensure that local emergency services are aware of any fire

To register your burn-off, phone 1800 668 511 or e-mail burnoffs@etsa.vic.gov.au and provide the following details:

- The location of the burn-off;
- The date and expected start/finish times;
- Estimated size of the fire; and
- What you intend to burn.

Residents can keep their burn-offs safe and legal by:

- Never leaving them unattended;
- Monitoring weather conditions;
- Having sufficient equipment and water nearby to stop the fire from spreading; and
- Checking fire restrictions in your area.

ROAMING LIVESTOCK CONCERNS

Livestock owners are reminded to ensure their animals are secured on their properties following a recent increase in the number of reported incidents of wandering livestock. Council staff had tended to an increasing number of calls relating to wandering livestock over the past few weeks. The recent run of foggy and frosty mornings poses added dangers for motorists driving without the risk of having to negotiate wayward livestock.

While some of the recent incidents Gannawarra Shire Council staff have tended to are a result of property gates being left open following spotlighting expeditions, most are due to the property owner or occupier failing to adequately maintain the fencing.

It is an offence to keep livestock on any property which is not securely fenced. Stock owners are responsible for the damage caused to life and property by their stock if they are not properly confined.

Stock owners can be fined up to \$8,050 for allowing livestock to escape onto public roads.

E-WASTE BAN IN PLACE

Residents are reminded that electronic materials that are no longer working or used are banned from being placed in kerbside rubbish bins and landfills throughout Victoria. E-waste refers to any item with a plug, battery or cord that is no longer working or wanted. These include computers, mobile phones, microwaves, printers, televisions, heaters and gaming consoles.

Council's Transfer Stations at Cohuna and Kerang can accept electronic items that require batteries to operate, or has a cord and plug. A \$25 charge applies for each computer monitor, laptop or television handed in as these items contain toxic chemicals - such as barium, phosphor, lead and hexavalent chromium – which require special handling.
