7.6 ROAD MANAGEMENT PLAN 2025

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council has completed its four-year statutory review of the Road Management Plan (RMP) and prepared an updated version – the Road Management Plan 2025. The revised Plan strengthens legislative references, updates inspection and intervention processes, and aligns with updated Local Laws and best practice asset management.

A 28-day public consultation period was undertaken from 21 August 2025 to 18 September 2025, with submissions received from residents in Cohuna, Kerang, and Koondrook. Feedback did not oppose the Plan, and no material changes were required post-consultation.

Council is now requested to formally adopt the updated Road Management Plan.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council has completed community consultation on the draft Asset Management Plan 2025–2035 and four supporting Sub-Plans for Buildings, Transport, Open Space, and Stormwater assets. Feedback received during the 28-day engagement period has been considered and incorporated, and the documents are now presented for Council's formal adoption to guide long-term infrastructure planning.

7.8 DOMESTIC ANIMAL MANAGEMENT PLAN 2026-2029

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Domestic Animals Act 1994 requires Council to prepare and adopt a Domestic Animal Management Plan (DAM Plan) every four years. The 2026–2029 Plan builds on the outcomes of the 2022–2025 Plan, incorporates feedback from community consultation, and has been benchmarked against plans from Casey, Bass Coast, and Swan Hill councils.

Key improvements in the new Plan include:

- Establishing a training register for Authorised Officers.
- Expanding community education programs (schools, signage, social media).
- Strengthening registration and identification strategies, including incentives.
- Enhancing compliance programs for nuisance animals and illegal breeders.
- Developing an improved annual evaluation.

7.9 PROPOSAL TO AMEND A 173 AGREEMENT RELATED TO LAND KNOWN AS 67 GONN AVENUE MURRABIT 3579

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report is being presented to Council to determine a proposal to amend a Section 173 Agreement entered into between Council and the landowner through a Planning Permit application to subdivide land into two lots. Planning Permit P11.027 was issued by Council on 16 August 2011, allowing the land to be subdivided into two lots to excise a rural dwelling (retained on Lot 1) and to remove a carriageway easement.

The land is in the Farming Zone. Accordingly, in considering the merits of the proposed excision of the dwelling, Officers relied on Council's Rural Excision Guidelines: Guidelines for Considering Small Lot Residential Excisions and Re-subdivisions in the Farming Zone to facilitate their assessment.

Council applies these Guidelines to facilitate the separation of dwellings which are no longer needed as part of a farming enterprise onto individual titles which can then be sold. The intention is to allow the dwelling to be sold, with the residual land being retained in a farming enterprise, while minimising conflicts between new residents and the existing farming practice.

A core element of the Guidelines is a requirement for a Section 173 of the Planning & Environment Act 1987 agreement to be entered into with the owner of each lot created by an excision or a resubdivision, which will prohibit further subdivision of the lot. This agreement then forms part of the land's Certificate of Title.

This Section 173 Agreement requirement was applied through Condition 7a of the planning permit, which required the owner to enter into a Section 173 Agreement, which would include:

7. a) The erection of a dwelling in the residual lot (lot 2) is prohibited.

This proposal to amend the Section 173 Agreement by deleting the requirement that a dwelling not be erected on lot 2, the residual lot, is contrary to the purpose of Council's *Rural Excision Guidelines*. The planning permit would not have been approved without this condition. Accordingly, it is recommended that the proposal be refused.
